Tradition two: (Unity)

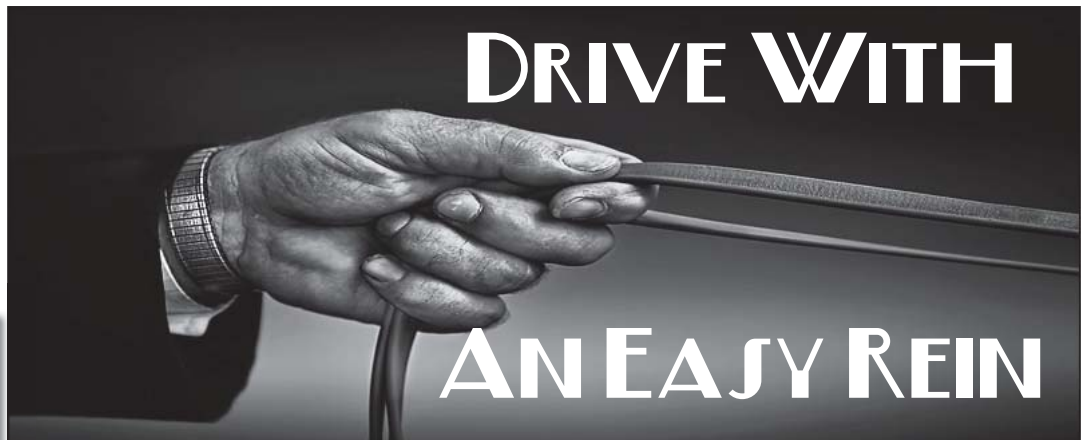
For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.

I was in my 60th year when I first contacted A.A. I had always been a steady and heavy drinker. Having what drinks I wanted was as much a natural part of my life as smoking. So far as I was able to tell at that time it had never interfered with my life, either business or social. Then business became slack, drinking heavier and more steady and, at some time unknown to me, alcohol took over and became the boss. I was only conscious of the intense physical and nervous discomfort and attributed the almost melancholic depression to these factors. I got to the end of my rope and life was not worth living. The end of the run was, morbidly, hoped for and would, I think, have been welcomed.

At this time I contacted A.A. I haven't the least recollection of what was said at the first meeting. One thing stood out, and that was the fact that these people had gone through the same slough of despond that I was in and now were normal and happy. So it *could* be done and they were the proof for they *had done it!* That fact was the piercing ray of light that was given me.

Then came the usual over-exaggerated depressions. But the group was always there to give balance and knowing advice. "Day by day" became month by month and gradually the old habits changed. And, believe me, Brother, habits don't change as easily at 60 as they do at 30! And then came the seemingly insurmountable matter of the "spiritual angle." In time, entirely unknown to me, that came to be a simple natural fact,

Tucson Area Intergroup, Inc. (TALL) Committee Meeting Minutes – January 11, 2015

Chair John A. opened the meeting at 1:30PM with the Serenity Prayer. Many people recognize the new chair from an unnamed online dating service. Plans to keep things informal by using "Bob's Rules of Order".

NEW INTERGROUP REPRESENTATIVES (IGRs): Jamie S., New Beginnings (Women); Wendy M., Happy Destiny; John M., Overton Sunday Morning; Jack K., Courage to Change; Karen T., Ironwood Hills; Karen S., Between the Tracks; Maggie C., Our Daily Bread; Jay T., Morning Shades; Lowman/James/Logan/Whatever, Courage to Share? <- I swear, he exists.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: JAMES W. The entire room reviewed December's minutes. Shyanne indicated that "Cheyenne" should be spelled "Cheyanne". Date on minutes should read "December 14th" not "November 9th". Nancy R. brings motion to approve minutes with above modifications, Chantland W. seconds; motion passes unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT: JOHN A. for NANCY John takes way too long to let us know the current available funds sit at \$27,302.37, which is 57% of our prudent reserve of \$48,050. In general, the prudent reserve has hovered under 50% for 2-3 years, so we are doing well. Craig W. unnecessarily motions to accept the treasurer's report, Barbara G. unnecessarily seconds the motion; the unnecessary motion passes unanimously. Reviewed bylaws and found that subcommittee budgets need to be approved by TALL as a whole. Initial approval retracted by administrative subcommittee.

ADMINISTRATIVE SUBCOMMITTEE: JAMES W. No quorum existed for the meeting due to vacated member-at-large positions, so no votes or action were taken. Will vote on minutes and any additional new business at the next administrative subcommittee meeting. We will be holding elections during new business for 4 open member-at-large positions.

CENTRAL OFFICE REPORT: LYNNE L., 882-7422 (Central Office) Home Answering Service (HAS) shifts are all filled for meow. End-of-year physical inventory was a success with 2 full shifts of people to help, turning it into a great social event. Attempts to replicate this with searching and fearless moral inventory unsuccessful. Vintage 1st Edition WWII Big Book being raffled by Central Office. Tickets are \$5 and there is not a fixed amount of tickets. IGRs may sign out tickets to sell at their homegroup. Big Book is being kept in a safe at an undisclosed location, much to the chagrin of those in attendance planning a midnight caper. Federal and State income taxes have been paid. Next Intergroup meeting will be held on February 8th.

CORRECTIONS REPORT: TED M. Committee is always looking for donations of soft-cover AA literature including Grapevines. 19 Big Books, and enough money to buy 20 more, were donated at the alcohons. Men are needed for Monday and Wednesday 6:30pm meetings at Pima County Jail. Contact Jack W. at 906-4888 for more information. For information on meetings for women, contact Colette B. at 909-4190. Things going well at Arizona State Prison Complex (ASPC) since switching back to coordinating with chaplain's office. 4+ volunteers cleared during last quarter with more on the way. Will be doing 4th step workshops on Manzanita and Santa Rita yards in January or February, with volunteers returning to listen to 5th steps. Contact Dennis W. at 977-8149 for more information. Saturday morning meeting at Juvenile Detention Facility is in need of chairs for 2 weeks per month. Southern Regional Community Corrections Center (SRCCC) is accepting new volunteers. Contact Dennis W. at 977-8149 for more information. New volunteers are not being accepted for Federal Prisons at this time. Volunteers needed for meetings at the Red Rock and Saguaro CCA private prisons in Eloy. Currently only 3 volunteers covering one meeting in each facility on Sunday mornings. Dante G. formed a pre-release contact committee and they have met for the first time with 5 in attendance. Hoping to bring attendance up to around 12. Will be meeting on the 1st Saturday of the month at 6PM at Central Office. Fliers and sign-up sheets are in circulation. Will be making a presentation at this month's District 11 meeting. Proposed 2015 budget submitted to TALL. Asked for \$500 increase to \$4000/yr. Orientation: Our next orientation is planned for Saturday, January 17, 2015 at 9:30 a.m. at Central Office. Bring a friend and enjoy free coffee and donuts. Meeting: Our next meeting is scheduled for Saturday, January 17, 2015 at 10:30 a.m. at Central Office. The Corrections Committee meets quarterly on the fourth Saturday in January, April, July and October.

COOPERATION WITH PROFESSIONAL COMMUNITY (CPC): JIM W.

Meredith L. has contacted Carrington College and is working with them to possibly start taking their nursing students to a meeting. Libraries are covered. Susan completed research on cost of using business cards to offset more expensive pamphlets. Central office provided a banner, so the committee will not need to have one made. Committee has evaluated which pamphlets to order for 2015. Committee attended Stand Down for Veterans event and was well received. Committee received a certificate from the event staff. Letters were sent out to several schools (including charter schools) this month. No responses to date. Meetings are held on the 4th Wednesday of every month at 5:30PM at Central Office.

AA OF THE AIR Speakers are currently taped at the Experience, Strength and Hope (ESH) Group which meets from 7-8 PM on Monday Nights at the Streams in the Desert Lutheran Church (5360 East Pima). This meeting is a 30 minute speaker followed by discussion. The speaker portion is not currently being broadcast and is meow being posted on aatucosn.org. AA of the Air is always looking for groups or individuals to sponsor future months. This involves bringing a 30 minute speaker for each Monday of the month they volunteer for.

HISTORIAN: NANCY R., 903-0245 Currently updating written history of AA in Tucson. Period covering beginning to 1983 has been updated, meow focusing on 1983-Present. Got lots of contacts for oldtimers at the alcohons. Will be doing group interviews with them to gather more information, apparently unaware as to how much oldtimers like to talk. Please ask around at your homegroups for any oldtimers who might have extensive knowledge of AA history in Tucson. Looking to borrow some sort of recording device to use during interviews.

GRAPEVINE (GV): VIVIAN W. Had first meeting of new year (and chair's first meeting) on 1/4. 6 reps in attendance. Collecting empty coffee cans to turn into GV collection cans to be given to homegroups. Annual subscription costs less than 56¢ per week, so every homegroup should be able to afford a subscription. If you have any unused or old GVs, please donate them so they can be taken into jails and prisons. Will be having an event to celebrate the GV's belated 70th birthday. Will have local authors reading their published GV stories, some of the "best" jokes from the GV, and a presentation on the history of the GV. Event will be held on April 19th from 1-4PM at Central Office. Hoping to be able to include issues of the GV in materials disseminated by CPC/PI committee. Please encourage your homegroup to elect a GV rep and send them to the meeting. Meetings are held on the 1st Sunday of odd months at 2PM at Central Office. Next meeting will be 3/1.

SPECIAL EVENT COMMITTEES Xmas Alcothon: Donna R. (TGIF Group) – Made \$829.27 after accounting for seed money and rent. Thank you to all who volunteered. NY Alcothon: Jackie H. (Tucson Area Committee of Young People in AA – TACYCAA), Dennis W. (Rincon Group) – Made ~\$777 after accounting for seed money and rent. Did not decide to take on the alcothon until beginning of December and would not recommend waiting that long. “Van-load of young boys” was quite helpful with clean-up. Comment was followed by uproarious laughter and continual jokes about aforementioned van-load. Custodian was very pleased with us. Events Coordinator: Cheyane T. – Heard that clean-up committee for xmas alcothon only consisted of 3 people. Please stick around after AA events to help clean up or else we will call your sponsor. Cheyanne was able to secure a position on the NY alcothon clean-up committee that involved lots of sitting down. Founders day is coming up in June. District 11 has expressed interest in chairing. There is a packet/guide available filled with information on how to host an alcothon.

SPANISH-SPEAKING (SS) INTERGROUP LIAISON: DENISE B-A. SS Intergroup would like to add a special section into Just for Today for SS AA event news. Also request that TALL meeting schedule be updated with latest info on SS AA meetings. Ask that HAS volunteers be given SS AA hotline number. Corrections chair would like to sign out / borrow TALL’s corrections box of materials. SS AA groups celebrate their group anniversaries. At the SS Intergroup meeting, each of the individual groups give a report along with reports from elected “liaisons” (treasurer, secretary, corrections, literature, public outreach, district). SS Intergroup also has a home answering service. They will pass a cell phone for the hotline between groups every month. The phone number is 622-5112. Next SS Intergroup meeting will be January 29th from 7:30-9PM at Grupo Tucson (2549 S. 6th Ave.)

AZ AREA LIAISON (INTERGROUP VICE CHAIR): KERMIE W. District treasury currently at \$3085.91 after substantial cost cutting. Topic of “Can AA be sued?” came up at district meeting in reference to current case resulting from murder of AA member in California. General Service Office (GSO) has a legal department which handles such issues. Will bring discussion to AZ Area as well. Importance of groups having an active General Service Representative (GSR) was discussed. Example of the GSR being the groups voice in important matters such as modification of AA literature was given. Sub-district 11-111 passed a budget and included an allocation for scholarships to bring GSRs from less-affluent groups to the area assemblies. Santa Cruz county asked to join District 11, which was approved. District 11-122 (SS AA) has started discussing group safety, which is a new topic to them. They have asked AZ Area Delegate Kathy F. to come have a discussion/workshop with them to include an English/Spanish interpreter. Workshop will held on January 17th at 22nd St. and Country Club at 7:30PM. Will be having a workshop on the steps in the spring. District Committee Member Chair (DCMC) will have a table at the alcohons to educate people about what the district and GSRs are doing and to answer any questions. Ad-Hoc committee met and drew up a budget, which was passed unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS: Committee budgets need to be voted on by TALL as a whole. Following annual committee budgets were presented: PI - \$250, Treatment - \$500, AA of the Air - \$250, Corrections - \$4000, CPC - \$300, Grapevine - \$500. Barbara G. motions to accept the proposed budget, Chantland W. seconds; motion passes unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS: Call for groups to sponsor Founders Day. District 11 offers to chair Founders Day. Unanimously approved by vote. Elections: Administrative Sub-Committee Members-at-Large: Moon M. (Solutions Group), Chantland W. (Sunday Night Young People), Barbara G. (Honest Open and Free), Jane R. (Midvale Morning Group), and John C. (Southwest Happy Hour) all stand for the 4 openings. Moon volunteers to serve as alternate, withdrawing himself from consideration. Remaining 4 candidates elected unanimously.

Meeting closed at 3:09pm (although it felt like 9:03PM) with Declaration of Unity and “I Am Responsible”.

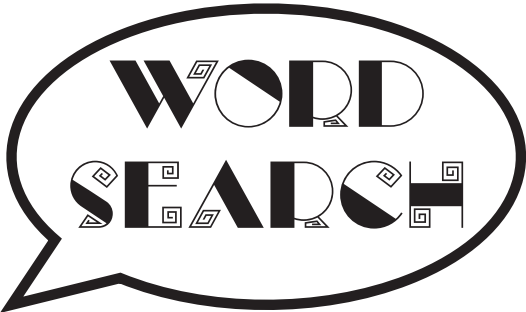

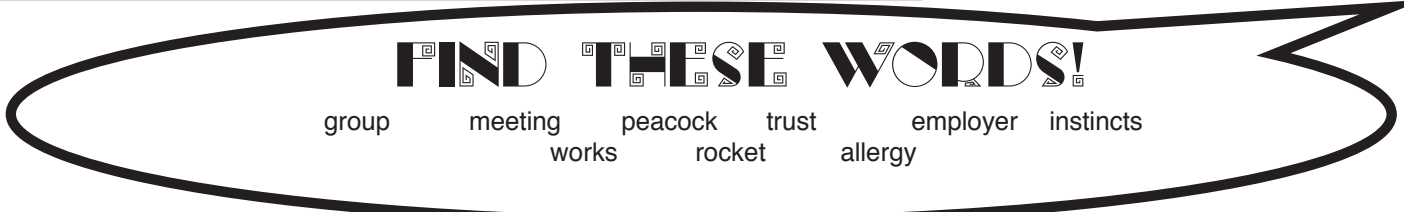
