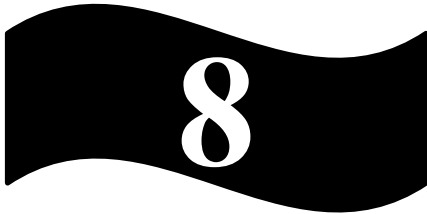

STEP EIGHT

Recovery

Made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.

TRADITION EIGHT

Unity

Alcoholics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers.

CONCEPT EIGHT

Service

The trustees are the principal planners and administrators of overall policy and finance. They have custodial oversight of the separately incorporated and constantly active services, exercising this through their ability to elect all the directors of these entities.

STEP 8: Made a List. Yikes!!!

Step 8 reads, “Made a list of all persons we had harmed and became willing to make amends to them all.” So let’s break that down....

“Made a list....” I sat in bed one night with paper and pen and began the list. Jeez! It seemed “all the persons [I] had harmed” was endless. I added most of my relatives, friends, and some employers and workmates. Then, of course, there was my ex-husband and previous and subsequent boy-friends.

I gazed at the list and felt acute shame. So what did I do? I closed my notebook, lay it on my bedside table, turned out the light and went to sleep.

I don’t recall ever opening it again. It was just too much to see the perceived damage I had done.

So the next bit, “And became willing...” wasn’t happening. At one of the meetings I attended, I heard someone say they were “willing to become willing.” I thought, “Ok. I can do that.” And weeks passed. Then months.

I also remember my sponsor telling me that “the steps are in order for a reason.” Another person suggested I do a step a month. That seemed like a good idea. I was a long way from eight months sober at that point, so I could delay the inevitable, right?

Even though the list itself was long gone, I had it locked in memory. When the time came, I knew who I would start with, and I also knew I’d save the difficult amends until I had some experience in hand. My ego still bruised easily.

Eventually the words, “to make amends” appealed to me not long after I passed the eight-month sobriety mark. Indeed! These steps really are in order for a reason.

Not only was I willing, but I wanted to “sweep off my side of the sidewalk.” I wanted a fresh start and some relief. My offenses weighed mightily, and I really related to a guy named Bruce in my home group who often used the phrase, “drop the rocks.” I also remember old timers telling me that **how** people responded to my amends was none of my business. That was their sidewalk to sweep, not mine. If they were still upset with me, then so be it. I had done what I needed to do to stay sober, and that’s what mattered.

Step 9? Bring it on!!! Not only was I willing, I was ready.
