STEP 2: Came to Believe — in Electrons

When an AA friend of mine took me to my first meeting, he gave me his Big Book (3rd Edition) and said, "Here. Read page 449 first. Then read pages 83 and 84. Then read Chapter 5. When you've done that, read the whole book cover to cover." So, as soon as that life-changing meeting was over, and he dropped me off at my car, I went home and did just that...sort of.

First came page 449, which talked to me about acceptance. Then I read the promises. Wow! That's exactly what I've been longing for...to know peace. Then came Chapter 5, and that's when a problem arose: "That probably no human power could have relieved our alcoholism. That God could and would if He were sought."

I didn't believe in God, and I saw the pages sprinkled with the word. I stopped reading Chapter 5. "No way will this work," I said to myself, so I went to the beginning of the book and started to flip through it and came to "We Agnostics." That's when I became a believer...not in Christian God, but in electrons! That chapter reminded me about powers greater than myself. I can't see electrons, but they hold my material world together.

Well, that seemed to take care of the first part of Step Two, but what about the "restore me to sanity" bit? Was I really that insane? Hmmm. Let's see. My relationships, especially the romantic ones, went up in smoke consistently. I felt a big hole in me that woke me up at night and kept me perpetually fearful. My opinion of myself was unrelentingly negative. I had behaved in ways that compromised my values and most likely were the source of gossip in the small town I lived in. I often thought about suicide.

Ok. That last one especially should be a clue. Ya think?? Then I remembered how I felt when I went to the meeting earlier that night. I felt like I had "come home." My gut told me I was very much in the right place among "my people." That this is where I could find my way out of misery and into healthy living. It was visceral knowledge.

I glanced again at Step Two. I asked myself, "Isn't misery the same as insanity?"

What sealed the deal for me was the next night when I went to a meeting. An outspoken, no-nonsense yet caring lady named Louise B handed me a small frame. In it was a hand-written message: Misery is optional.

I came to believe it then, and I still believe it now.

The meeting was called to order with the Serenity Prayer at 1:40 pm

Secretary's Report - Maureen A for Cheyanne T. Cory motioned to approve the minutes, Mandy seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report - Jim W. for Walt W. As of today we are at 47% of our prudent reserve. Let groups know that despite popular rumors, Central Office is not closing its doors.

I AM RESPONSIBLE, WHEN ANYONE, ANYWHERE....

I have received more Hot Line 12 step call requests in the past 10 days as I have my entire time in sobriety. I even received 3 in one day! I asked if I was the only woman in zip code **85705** and learned that I was. **Ladies!!** Where are you?

At meetings we recite the Responsibility Pledge. Do we hear what we are saying? What does it mean? What does it have to do with me?

1973 was the first time I called the Hot Line. At that time I had a husband problem, years from realizing my true problem was alcohol. I asked the responding person if seeing spots had anything to do with my drinking. He broke out in laughter, and funny it is! I hung up very resentful and continued to drink wondering what the problem was.

My first meeting was in 1974. It took me 4 ½ years going to lots of meetings, going through the motions of step work, incapable of being honest, and constantly changing environments. Inevitably the day came when I returned to drink. Fortunate to return in 1978.

Back to the 12 Step list: Dedicated members of our Alcoholics Anonymous fellowship take time slots of the Hot Line answering calls from folks looking for a meeting, seeking help during their moments of suffering, and an assortment of other inquiries. **LADIES, ARE YOU ON THE LIST?** Are you responsible?

LADIES! 85705 encompasses I-10 to the west, 5th Street to the south, First Avenue to the east, and River Road to the north. This is a very large area to have only one woman to receive a call for help. We cannot keep our sobriety unless we give it away. You may be saying, "Yes, I know, I do that in meetings." How lucky many of us are to have the means to attend any meetings we want. What about the sufferer who has no transportation, who is afraid, who is new to town, who may not realize what her problem is?

The first 12 Step Call I received was in my first year. I was scared when I took it. I called a friend with long sobri-

February 2018 Marks 75 Years of AA History in Tucson

On Monday, February 22, 1943, two men held the first meeting of Alcoholics Anonymous ever held in Tucson (or, for that matter, in all of Arizona). The "father" of AA in Tucson was an Army Air Corps captain named Ham B. who was stationed at Davis-Monthan. Ham and his wife had come to Tucson from California, where Ham had been introduced to AA. He had searched Tucson for another alcoholic to reach out to and he had met Frank C., a tailor.

Not much is known about that first meeting. It's likely that "How it Works" was read and that each man shared his experiences. They met each week and had daily contact between meetings. AA in Tucson grew very slowly at first (the third member didn't come along until May), but by September they claimed 13 members and registered with the New York headquarters as the Tucson Group.

From these humble beginnings has grown the Tucson area AA that we have today. The story of Tucson AA from its beginnings through 1984 is told in Mark on the Gate. Today we are working to update Mark on the Gate to the present, and we invite your help.

If you have a story about your experience in Tucson area AA at any time since 1985, please share it with us.
