## STEP 2: What I Had To Believe

I had hit bottom. I could no longer rely on my current thinking, beliefs and values to support the good life I had wanted and in which I once believed.

I had gone to a psychologist in Indiana with a halfhearted desire to do something to avoid those tragic episodes. I rejected the counseling because the group were druggies” and not a “revolutionary cutting edge change agent” like me. Then too, the psychologist gave me antabuse which I took, drank and almost killed me My ‘self will run riot’ had driven me to the edge of giving up on overcoming alcoholism. I was hapless and hopeless. No plan. If there was no answer, its over. I would have to just give up. Such a fatal decision could end in early suicide, death, insanity, and even jail.

I had lost all belief in myself and the ability to control and manage what might happen to me if I drank. I became desperate to think about what, if any, resource I could grab to rescuer me from drowning in in an alcoholic abyss. Gone were my phony props and self-delusion driven by the passions and excitement of life in the late sixties.

Yet, some small flame of hope still burned deep inside. That hope was nourished by scenes of Jack Lemon at an AA podium in the movie, Days of Wine and Roses. And after viewing my Gary-bound Purdue students’ group work, I had also yearned to be part of and accepted by a caring and understanding group.

Owing my deep and defiant resistance to false spiritual prophets and precepts, I marveled at the existence over two million world wide sober members of AA. There were over thousand meetings in one hundred and eighty countries. My Navajo friends joked that I should “eat mutton because a thousand coyotes couldn’t be wrong.”

I wanted to find out what that “power greater than themselves” was. I was told that AA didn’t require that I believe anything. My complete abandonment of Catholicism made me weary of any spiritual program that demanded and described my belief. I discovered that I could define my own Higher Power (HP) and its nature and role in my life. AA was not a hidden con for me to come to “J.” The term “God” was just a synonym to HP.

The AA group became the foundational HP for me. My sponsor Rick H suffered hell and high water without a drink or even depression through his dependence on HP. I wanted what he had and would go to any lengths to get it. “Oh right Rick, find my own HP, work the steps and have an open mind.”

To continue on the AA path of recovery requires me taking this tough step. Many die at it its doorstep. My grandiosity and arrogance that been telling me that I could do everything even the impossible. So many times I sat and mused with hope that I could change my life by my own thinking and commitment. I had what it takes to stop. Coming to Believe would mean demanding all belief that I could take care of things and that I had the resources to govern my own life would be given up.

The demons of disbelief come and go in there assaults. I don’t have to look up so much anymore. I look down at the miracles I hear at every meeting and listen to HP. Of what does one say and think of those who claim AA suggests pie in the sky, mass group hysteria, self-hypnotism etc? None of these can explain the miracles. The probability of events described by so many AA is beyond logical explanation. For Albert Einstein that
