9

STEP NINE

Recovery

Made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.

TRADITION NINE

Unity

A.A., as such, ought never be organized; but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.

CONCEPT NINE

Service

Good service leadership at all levels is indispensable for our future functioning and safety. Primary world service leadership, once exercised by the founders, must necessarily be assumed by the trustees.

STEP 9: SELF-DISCIPLINE

The next word on my now rather grimy 3" x 5" card was *Self-discipline*. I didn't like that word at all. Growing up in my home, discipline meant punishment and self-discipline meant self-punishment; like all those weight-loss diets I failed. I felt pretty gloomy about Step 9.

My sponsor said, while sometimes discipline meant punishment, there was another, benign definition. Discipline was following a spiritual path. The Twelve Steps were a spiritual path. I had already incorporated eight of the steps into my life. While some of them had been difficult, I never felt any sense of punishment; in fact I felt a sense of freedom and well-being. Now, the definition of self-discipline was closer to a sense of purpose.

My sponsor said that Step 9 was neither an apology, nor a plea for forgiveness. I was to approach each person and state what harmful behavior I had done, and to tell that person that I was *wrong* and *they did not deserve* it. I was to ask them how I could make it up to them, plus ask if there were any other harm I had done, that I was not aware of.

My sponsor said this amends-making-process would require a lot of self-discipline, but I had agreed I was willing to go to any length to stay sober. I would need to incorporate Honesty, Courage, Faith, Integrity, Willingness, Humility and Love into my amends process. I had my list and so I began. I was scared doing the first few on my list, but each person graciously accepted my amends and some even said I really didn't owe them anything.

The amend I dreaded the most was to my birth father. Thankfully, he lived in New York City and I was living in the Silver City, NM area. So, I wrote him a letter, stating what my harms to him had been and that I was wrong and he didn't deserve it. Then I added that not drinking and being in AA was changing my life for the better. Maybe he would like to try it? I don't know if he understood my letter, because he drank all day, every day. I'm glad I made my amends to him, because two and half years later he died suddenly of cirrhosis and alcoholism.

The last amend on my list, which I procrastinated on for three years, was: Paying off my Student Loans from the Government. I had moved back to Albuquerque by this time and had a different sponsor. She said, "You signed the contract for the loans; now it is time to pay the Government back." Six years after I graduated, I began making monthly payments, which seemed to take forever. But, I did it! Now I have a good credit rating and the Government didn't need to garnish my Social Security!

I began to realize that making amends was really LOVE in action. And LOVE is the best discipline.

The meeting was called to order with the Serenity Prayer at 1:30PM. There were ~30 attendees.

Secretary's Report: Ted M., for Cheyanne T. Stacia moves to accept July minutes as corrected, Jeri seconds, motion passes. Correction: Grapevine report to begin, "There were..." rather than "The were..."

Treasurer's Report: Dana L. TAII is currently at 54% of prudent reserve, but this is as of July 31 before bills were paid; actual number is between 20-25%. Both group and individual contributions are down.
