STEP TWO

Came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.

TRADITION TWO

For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority – a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants, they do not govern.

CONCEPT TWO

The General Service Conference of A.A. has become, for nearly every practical purpose, the active voice and the effective conscience of our whole society in its world affairs.

STEP 2: Return to Sanity

In Step Two I was asked to believe that a Power greater than I could restore me to sanity. This was not too difficult as I had witnessed AA work in my family. It was challenging, however, to think that AA was actually going to work for me. In the beginning I clung to the people who had experience, strength and hope. I hoped some of their sanity might rub off on me. Day by day, as I slowly went through my somewhat sad life, I only had space in my brain to constantly repeat “I will not drink today.” And, amazingly, I did not drink. This was the beginning of sanity returning.

The first signs of improvement I recognized in my early sober life were very simple. I started to live in the daytime rather than creeping around in the dark of night. I slowly learned how to be a parent. I was willing to learn how to do this program. Although my thought processes were very damaged, I somehow hung in there not drinking long enough until I could begin to think somewhat clearly. This Power greater than I was simply the AA program at work in my life. I was incapable of expanding on that. I was told that was all I needed to do: believe in this amazing program and I would get better.

I have been restored to sanity. Over the years I’ve learned how to manage myself through the other steps of our program. This doesn’t mean I always do the sane, correct thing. I’ve taken many wrong paths along the way. The one insane thing I haven’t done is drink. At any given moment, I can think like a spoiled child. I know now that I don’t have to act on these thoughts.

Now I have the privilege of watching others being restored to sanity. Watching this program work in their lives as well as my own has given me an unshakeable faith in AA. This is sanity for me.

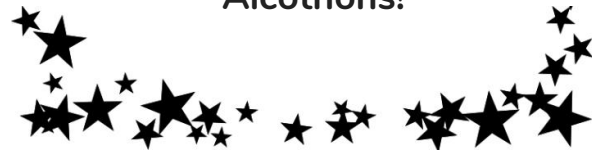
