1

STEP ONE

We admitted we were powerless over alcohol – that our lives had become unmanageable.

TRADITION ONE

Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends upon A.A. unity.

CONCEPT ONE

Final responsibility and ultimate authority for A.A. world services should always reside in the collective conscience of our whole Fellowship.

STEP 1: Asking for Help

My drinking career was relatively short. I drank for eight years. However, in that period of time, I managed to make a complete mess of my own life and that of several others who happened to be around me.

From early childhood I remember being angry. By the time I was a teenager, I was not only angry, I was confused, had low self-esteem and was convinced my life would be better if I was someone else. Then along came booze. The first time I drank I was almost immediately in a blackout. This continued until I quit. I'm not sure I really liked drinking since I was quite unsuccessful at it but it did give me some peace from my thoughts. I stubbornly persisted in my futile way of life until I knew somehow, that one particular day, I should do something about my drinking as I couldn't go on like this.

It was 1965 and in those days one called AA and asked for help. That's exactly what I did. I had never acknowledged to anyone (least of all myself) that I needed assistance. And what help I got! Two lovely ladies come to the motel where I was holed up that evening and shared some of their experience with me. They also told me from here on I would not drink again – a day at a time. Just don't drink!! What a concept. They gave me instructions: ask for help in the morning, don't pick up the first drink during that day and say thanks at night for the help that I received. The simple act of giving up, admitting I was powerless over alcohol, my life was unmanageable and following simple instructions has given me almost 55 years of uninterrupted sobriety and a life worth living. In the months to come I will share my experience with the other steps. More will be revealed....
