### STEP TWO

*For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority— a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.*

### CONCEPT TWO

*The General Service Conference of A.A. has become, for nearly every practical purpose, the active voice and the effective conscience of our whole Society in its world affairs.*

### **Came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.**

When I got to AA and looked at the steps up on the wall I figured I could knock those out in a few weeks. As for Step Two, I'd had years of parochial school education and besides, I was damn sure I was sane. To that, my first sponsor just laughed and told me, "More will be revealed."

As the years have passed, I have seen what came to believe was actually telling me. It's a living process and my awareness of my creator continues to grow and change. Once I got past the idea that Sister Annunciata would put me in detention if I got it wrong, I realized that *God as I understood Him* meant exactly that. I was free to find a higher power I could relate to. I didn't even have to say it was a he or call it God. It was MY higher power – full stop. And I could take as much time finding it as I wanted and I could change my mind when the need arose.

People at my meetings would describe their higher powers in all sorts of ways, everything from my cat or a door knob to more conventional religious concepts of God. It was up to them and no one told them they were wrong. The only part of the twelve steps which was italicized was the part that referred to God as I understood Him and that right was and is strenuously guarded. Good thing too. Like most alcoholics, I will not be told what to do.

As for the damn well sane part, it really didn't take much effort to convince me that the way I had lived was insane. I was a blackout drinker who drove while I was so drunk I had to close one eye to see only one road. I was sick to my stomach and so hung over I could barely function and I couldn't wait to do it again. I was compelled to do it again. There is no other way to describe that kind of behavior except as insane.

Through all of it the voice of my higher power spoke through the people at the meetings. They have told me about all the things that await me if I choose to live life as an active alcoholic and addict. I've known two wonderful, gentle men who have spent time in jail for killing another person in a blackout. They cannot remember doing it. There was another man whose five year old son was killed while riding in a car he drove while he was drunk. He cried at a meeting as he talked about it saying that it didn't matter how long he spent in jail, his son would never come back. I drove drunk with my two kids in the car all the time. So many times people have spoken about incidents that I narrowly escaped myself, but for the grace of God. Other times they have spoken about things I actually have done and carried deep shame around. They hugged me and told me I never have to live that life again if I don't want to.

Oh, and by the way, I have not managed to "knock off" those steps on the wall in a few weeks. The beautiful part of it all is that I get to do them all the time. They are a way of life – a beautiful way of life.

# Intergroup Meeting Minutes

**January 9, 2022 Meeting opened at 1:30 with the Serenity Prayer**

**New Intergroup Representative Introductions** – Terry – Hopi; Camille – Free at Last; Sarah – Morning Shades; Gerri – Smoke Free Nooners; Bob – Smile Group; Chip – New Vice Chair,

**Quarterly Report – Steve A. Quarterly Report – Steve A. – October 2021** –We voted to allow Jim W. and Lynne L. to hire JoyceJean as a substitute Central Office Coordinator.

**November 2021**–Walt W. (Ad Hoc Central Office Committee Chair) reported that the Landlord for Central Office was asking for us to pay rent that is out of our previously determined price range. We discussed moving Central Office & voted to pay the landlord \$1500 per month until we move. We also discussed finding a new Central Office Coordinator with resumes due 12/10/21.

**December 2021** – Ad Hoc Committee pursued various centrally located properties within our price range and toured one “stand-out” located at Alvernon and 6<sup>th</sup> and adjacent to St. Marks church. We discussed moving Central Office to St. Mark’s Church and the challenges this location might present. There was a seconded motion made to pursue negotiations with the Pastor of the Church. Motion passed on the Intergroup floor.

Administrative Subcommittee interviewed three well-qualified candidates to fill position vacated by Jim Wade, Central Office Coordinator. It was decided that Teri Porter would be offered the position with a start date of January 3<sup>rd</sup>. Teri accepted the position.

At the end of the month, members of the Ad Hoc Central Office committee completed third walk-through of prospective new location with contractors and developed a proposal for tenant improvements to be completed before move-in could occur. St. Mark’s Administrative Committee meets to approve this proposal on Jan. 6<sup>th</sup>. Thanks to outgoing committee chairs and A.S.C. members.

**Secretary’s Report – Maureen A.** – Motion made to accept minutes, seconded, motion passed.

**Treasurer – Patty C.** – We have \$74,963.59 total operating funds. We also have a prudent reserve of \$17,346.42 which equals 15% of our annual budget.

**Central Office – Lynne L/Teri P.** – We now have a new Central Office Coordinator, Teri P. She started on Jan. 3, 2022. She comes to us with a great background of service work in Tucson and Arizona. We are so glad she is here. We have one Home Answering Service shift available on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sat. from 5:30 to 10pm. We still need 12-step volunteers. You can call Central Office for information. We especially need 12-step volunteers from Green Valley. We will be moving Central Office.

**Central Office Ad Hoc Committee Update – Walt W.** – A lot has happened since the last report. We have met several times at St. Marks Presbyterian church to go over details to prepare the facility for our occupancy. We were asked last week to submit a written proposal detailing what we would like to see done to the facility before we move into it. We received a response from the church Friday where they raised some concerns about the work to be done. We have tentatively agreed on a lease amount of \$1,200 which also includes a small classroom we can use to store the stuff in our two outside sheds. We are still having discussion about the length of the lease and future increases as well as the proposed work.

The improvements to be done will include new flooring and paint throughout. Doors will be increased in size to improve accessibility. A new sink and counter will be installed for coffee service. A partial wall will be removed to increase the size of the meeting room

Because of the time taken to negotiate the terms and the work to be accomplished we are now looking at a proposed March move-in timeframe. We will provide our current landlord notice of our intent to move out as soon as we have the lease signed with St. Mark’s.

**Bridge the Gap** – Position Open – No Report.

**PI /CPC–Pat S.** - We discussed a possible opportunity to work with CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) volunteers in Pima county. One of our committee members has contacts with this program which has significant exposure to adults whose children are in foster care due to parental involvement with the criminal justice system. Many Parents are involved due to alcoholism and drug addiction.
