We admitted that we were powerless over alcohol—that our lives had become unmanageable.

I take a drink, the drink takes a drink and the drink takes me.

I became a frightened, hopeless mess, crying in the spare room after another particularly embarrassing evening, a good deal of which I could not remember. I did remember a screaming fight with my husband, whom I loved deeply and even then believed was sent to me by God. It was time to do something. One more drink was not going to fix it. My self-loathing knew no bounds. I would wake up in the morning sorry I was still alive, and worst of all, I was beginning to see those feelings reflected in my husband's eyes. I knew I could not go on or I would destroy everything I held dear. I was terrified that without a drink to hide behind, I'd really see how useless and pitiful I'd become.

I had had enough. I became willing to try something I'd really thought was too shameful to bear. I was desperate enough to go to an AA meeting. They welcomed me warmly and told me there was a solution in the steps of AA. They verified what I was most of afraid of; that I could not take another drink; that a drink would only keep me on the path I was on—a road of misery. They looked happy and at peace with themselves. They laughed and hugged and seemed to genuinely love one another. I listened as closely as my addled brain would let me and I realized they were very much like me. Their stories were different but the feelings were the same. God was with me that day in 1989 and I decided to come back and keep coming back.

It's important that I remember that time in my life because I never want to go back there. I now see myself as a woman I respect and I now have the same love and serenity I saw that first night. It hasn't been the bleak life I'd imagined all those years ago. Of course it hasn't always been easy, but the rewards have been far beyond anything I could have imagined then.

The husband I was so afraid of losing remains the love of my life and as long as I don't drink life will remain a blessing beyond measure.
