12

### STEP Twelve

*Having had a spiritual awakening as a result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to other alcoholics, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.*

### TRADITION Twelve

*Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.*

### CONCEPT Twelve

*The conference shall observe the spirit of A.A. tradition, taking care that it never becomes the seat of perilous wealth or power; that sufficient operating funds and reserves be its prudent financial principle; that it place none of its members in a position of unqualified authority over others; that it reach all important decisions by discussion, vote, and, whenever possible, substantial unanimity; that its actions never be personally punitive nor an incitement to public controversy; that it never perform acts of government; that, like the Society it serves, it will always remain democratic in thought and action.*

## Step 12

For me, a **spiritual awakening** was the realization that a life of sobriety was the greatest gift I could receive. I began to see that I had not been present for my life, that those little goodies I took to "just take the edge off" had dulled my senses to the point where I just simply wasn't there any longer. After two or three months of working the program, colors began to look brighter. I began to realize that what I had thought was the solution had really been the problem. I had found a safe place and it wasn't in the bottle. I found that the more meetings I attended, the less overwhelming life became. I had found a safe place.

My friends at the meetings told me that, if I wanted to keep what I had found, I was going to need to give it away. My first sponsor said that whenever anything was asked of me in AA, if there was any way I could do it, I needed to say yes. As I became more and more involved in the program I gained a greater sense of satisfaction with how I was dealing with my own life. I worked the program, I did the steps, and at last my sponsor told me I was ready to sponsor other women. Through the process of carrying the message to others, I learned how to love other people. Here I began to find a respect for myself I had never had before. In the process of reading the Big Book and working the steps with other women, I found a deeper understanding of the gift I had been given. As we shared our struggles with staying sober and with life in general, I began to find a new beauty in life just as it is.

Of course I will practice these principles in all my affairs. These principles are the key to a way of living that I had not believed was even possible. It is a precious gift that I will do everything I can to keep and share with others.

# Intergroup Meeting Minutes

Tucson Area Intergroup, Inc. (T.A.I.I.) November 13, 2022

**The meeting opened at 1:30pm with the Serenity Prayer**

**New IG Rep Intros:** Betsy S. filling in for Elizabeth for Basic AA.

**Chair's Quarterly Subcommittee Report- Steve A. - August 2022** – The Subcommittee continued discussion about the need for storage space in our new location. We discussed options such as buying a shed, renting storage space, or a storage container, etc. Terry B. suggested purchasing a steel storage container because it is weatherproof. He agreed to research this, and we voted to spend up to 7k to purchase a steel storage container. It was suggested to the Subcommittee that we be more financially transparent. We discussed whether to publish more financial information for Intergroup in the JFT. We discussed this at length and decided to table the issue for further discussion due to time constraints. **September 2022** - We continued discussion about whether we should print Intergroup financial information in the JFT, place it on the website, or something else. As all budget, expenses, and financials are available to Intergroup reps monthly at the intergroup meeting and to any AA member upon request, and due to space limitations in JFT, we decided that at the end of the Secretary's minutes each month we would add the following sentence in bold: **“Any member can request a copy of a detailed expense report/profit and loss statement for intergroup by emailing Central Office at info@aatucson.org.”** The storage container within our budget was identified and the committee decided to move forward with purchase. **October 2022** - We discussed replacing the storage shed that was delivered because it ugly and the door did not open properly. Consequently, the final storage shed that was chosen was painted to match our buildings' trim. It was delivered and looks much better. We also discussed having a vote in 2 months to add the job description to the bylaws for the Events Chair. We determined to announce in the following Intergroup meeting that we would bring it to a vote in December 2022. There was a brief discussion on updating phones and computers as the equipment on hand is very old and approaching being obsolete. The need for updated equipment has been an ongoing discussion which the subcommittee loosely included with the location move. We've tried to approach these associated tasks methodically and, in a way so as not to disrupt the day-to-day operations of Central Office. Teri P. will look into upgrading internet and phone system. Tentatively decided that once equipment is updated, we can look at monies remaining and come up with a plan if there is a surplus. Discussion on this will continue.

**Secretary's Report – Maureen A.** – Motion made to accept the minutes. Seconded. Motion passed.

**Treasurer's Report – Patty C.** - Current available funds for operating total of \$76,222.51 which is equal to 8.3 months operating expenses. We also have established a savings account holding our prudent reserve of \$ 17,226.06. **Any member can request a copy of a detailed expense report/profit and loss statement for intergroup by emailing Central Office at info@aatucson.org.**

**CENTRAL OFFICE NEWS – Teri P. / Lynne L.** - The month of October – has been reconciled. Federal Taxes have been paid. We are in the process of changing internet and phone services to Cox. We will be keeping the hotline with Century Link as Cox does not have an 800# call forwarding service. We have purchased the shipping container for storage. It was professionally painted the same color as the trim on the building and is housed behind the building. The landlord is charging us \$25 + 3.1% TPT tax for a total \$25.77 monthly for the extra square footage. According to our lease, we are required to have the HVAC serviced quarterly so we will be establishing a maintenance contract with Record Energy Concepts, Inc. Teri will be signing the contract with The Woman's Club for the Alcothons on Monday 11/14/2022. We are paying a refundable \$500 security deposit (\$250 for each Alcothon) and \$2200.00 for the rent (\$1100.00 for each Alcothon). Please call the business line at 520-882-7422 to volunteer for any of the following service opportunities: We have four Home Answering Service shifts available. If you have one or more years of sobriety, a telephone a half hour for training and willingness to help fellow alcoholics, we need you. Current Openings: 3rd Wednesday 6:00 -9:30 AM; 1st Sunday 5:30 – 10:00 PM; 4th Saturday 1:30-5:30 PM; 1st Sunday 10:00 PM-6:00AM. Our Twelfth Step list is dwindling. We are especially in need of young females and out of town people. The 12th step commitment is done primarily over the phone and requires at least a year of sobriety. Our Home Answering Service volunteers contact people from the 12th step list to call people back when they need to talk. This ensures that the hotline remains open for calls. We also use volunteers to work at the front desk at Central Office for four hours once a week and currently have one spot to fill: Thursday afternoons from 1:30 -5:30 pm.

**Corrections – Emil B.** – Ted spoke to people in PHX to get applications ready for background checks for the prisons. Still working on getting volunteers cleared. Jails are open for meetings. More orientations will be coming. Women and men are taking meetings into the jail. First step to get into jail meetings is a background check that doesn't take very long. Then an orientation, then volunteers can take in meetings. Next orientation is on November 29 at 2:30pm at the jail. The date is January 25th from 12:00 - 1:30 pm It will be virtual, including guests from GSO. John P. from the Upon Awakening group has agreed to participate. Terry is researching opportunities for Placing PI posters on Sun Tran Busses. PI Initiative Library Initiative: All 21 libraries have a copy of the Big Book. In addition, even the Pima County Library Bookmobile has a copy aboard! Great job Terry! At our September meeting we assembled packets of pamphlets Terry will deliver to the Pima County Library to be distributed to local library branches. Next Door App: Karrie T. reports admission requests have slowed over the last 3 months. Overall, 468 admission requests have been vetted for the App since its inception in Spring of 2020. Thank You Karrie! Joint PI/CPC initiative: Ideas for a new design for info/rack cards for contact with AA in Tucson discussed and Dottie P. has volunteered her talents to design a new card. We will be reviewing some final drafts at our November meeting. General Discussion: PSAs - Contact local Radio Stations, April is Alcohol Awareness Month, Tables/Exposure at Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year Alcothons.

**Homebound Outreach - Terry Z.** - We had our first committee meeting at the end of October; we came away with some great suggestions / ideas: We inquired about the legal liability of our visits ... are the volunteers covered while out on a visit? Teri P contacted our legal counsel, and bottom line, YES, they are covered. It was suggested to contact Adult Protective Services and ask them to our January 2023 meeting. They could let us know what services are available to us. We talked about researching other area intergroups to see what they did, if anything, along these lines. We have recruited Eileen B from Sub-District 11-119 to assist us with this (Eileen is the newest member to the committee). She has put together a list of the different area intergroups - 13 - and is working toward contacting each of them. At her Sub-District business meeting, Eileen spoke with the newsletter chair, who has agreed to include the information about the Homebound Outreach Program in the next issue of the Sobriety STAR! We will be putting together a pamphlet, to not only alert groups that such a program exists, but to show 'how' it works in the community. We'll also highlight a few personal experiences; this can be used for the pamphlet rack in Central Office and to be sent out to the different area intergroups as a follow-up to Eileen's calls. We've got much to do to prepare for our next meeting in January.

**Seventh Tradition-** The 11<sup>th</sup> Tradition was read aloud to the group.

**Spanish Speaking Liaison – Sara B.** - The Hispanic Intergroup Office continues to distribute business cards to all the groups. Subdistrict 16-160 is motivating to support the 2023 convention. At least 25 volunteers are needed. Contact Carlos if interested (602) 413-8695. Planning is underway for an end-of-the-year potluck at the Hispanic Intergroup Office. There is a need to create Corrections Committee but so far, no volunteers.

**Area Liaison/Vice Chair – Chip J.** - I attended the AZ Area 03 November Assembly, held on Nov. 5, 2022. The assembly was hybrid, with the in-person portion in Mesa, AZ, at the Arizona Golf Resort. I attended via Zoom. The main business of the assembly was to approve the AZ Area 03 budget for 2023. The budget was based on the 2018-2019 budgets since those were the last "non-COVID" years. The Delegate reported that a new "jacketless" Big Book and 12 & 12 will appear in November. The Delegate reported that the Conference motion from AZ regarding the plain language Big Book is still going through the process to be considered at the 2023 General Service Conference. The Corrections Coordinator reported that there may be Zoom participation from AZ yards in the upcoming Corrections Conference. We may also be allowed to have Zoom participation of prison groups at future assemblies. There were several positive reports from people who attended the Pacific Regional Forum in Salt Lake City. The next AZ Area 03 assembly will be the Pre-Conference Assembly, in March 2023. It will be in Tucson (hosted by subdistrict 11-114), and I plan to attend in person.
