1

### STEP ONE

*We admitted we were powerless over alcohol—that our lives had become unmanageable.*

### TRADITION ONE

*For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.*

### CONCEPT ONE

*Final responsibility and ultimate authority for A.A. world services should always reside in the collective consciousness of our whole Fellowship.*

## Step 1

### The Gift of Surrender

Her name was Sylvia B., and she took no prisoners. She had this sense—a sixth sense—for when an ego was getting too big. She expertly (almost surgically) would nail your ego to the floor and tell you where you could stick whatever idea got in your head.

At any rate, we had a newcomer at the Big Book meeting. In keeping with our group conscience, we chose a reading to discuss from More About Alcoholism. As I picked up the Big Books to return to the bookshelf, Sylvia B. came up to talk to me. "The most important thing to remember about the first step, Sarah," she patiently said, "is that it's all about surrender. We surrender to the reality that we are alcoholics, and our behavior has made our lives unmanageable."

She's right. Surrender, in its most simple form, is letting go to get a grip. I explain it to my sponsees: Imagine you're a soldier in some far-off, wild, and dangerous area, and things in the battle are going terribly. Everything you've been trained to do—how to fight—is failing you. Everything you're doing is worsening the situation.

Suddenly, a buzz on your radio. It's your CO, and he's ordering you to go to the nearest road, sit down, and wait for instructions. It's a drastic change in orders; all the same, you follow them, and, like magic, they work. You don't feel so hopeless; maybe a little relieved. You maybe even take a nap or eat. But you stop fighting; you sit, rest, and wait for instructions.

As you get comfortable sitting on the side of the road, waiting for instructions from your CO, a farmer comes by, steering a donkey that is pulling his wagon into town. "Would you like a ride?" he offers.

That's what Sylvia B. was trying to get me to understand that night: surrender is a critical and unspoken part of the 1st step, and is a true gift. In surrender, we are being offered a new handle on our current situation; our behavior, we realize, is unacceptable. We realize that no one is doing this to us; we are doing it to ourselves. Given that we are the ones punishing ourselves, we can change. We have an opportunity to reshape the landscape and look again at our circumstances. We start looking at our immaturity for what it is, rather than defending it for anything else.

Surrender to win, if you will.

# Intergroup Meeting Minutes

Tucson Area Intergroup, Inc. (T.A.I.I.) December 11, 2022

**The meeting opened at 1:30pm with the Serenity Prayer**

**New IG Rep Intros:** Terri – Twelve@Twelve Group. Ivory – Basic AA Group IG Rep starting January. Pam – new IG for Between the Tracks Group in Vail.

**Steve A. gave a big Thank you to outgoing Chairs/Officers**

**Secretary's Report – Maureen A.** – Teri P. stated for Homebound Committee minutes – she contacted the insurance agent, not legal counsel. Motion made to accept the minutes with amendment. Seconded. Passed.

**Treasurer – Patty C.** - Current available funds for operating total of \$67,563.13 which is equal to 7.37 months operating expenses. We also have established a savings account holding our prudent reserve of \$17,565.65, (\$338.15 was incorrectly deposited to savings by bank on 11/7/2022. This has since been transferred to checking), which equals 17% of our annual budget.

**CENTRAL OFFICE NEWS – Teri P.** - The month of November has been reconciled. Federal Taxes for December have been paid. We have decided that we will be keeping our phone lines with Century Link and changing only our internet service to Cox. The administrative subcommittee approved the purchase of a new computer since the one we currently have is approximately 15 years old. We made that purchase along with a 2 TB external hard drive on 12/8/2022. We are in the process of transferring files from the old PC to the new. We are waiting to see if a new laptop will also be needed after the internet has been switched to Cox. We are also planning to upgrade our outdated phone equipment. Please call the business line at 520-882-7422 to volunteer for any of the following service opportunities: If you have one or more years of sobriety, a telephone, a half hour for training and willingness to help fellow alcoholics for a few hours once a month, we need you for the Home Answering Service. Current Openings: 3rd Wednesday 6 -9:30 AM and 1st Sunday 10 PM-6AM. Our Twelfth Step list is dwindling. The 12th step commitment is done primarily over the phone and requires at least a year of sobriety. To ensure that the hotline remains open for calls, our Home Answering Service volunteers contact people from the 12th step list to call people back when they need to talk. We also use volunteers to work the front desk at Central Office for four hours once a week. We currently have all slots filled but if interested in training for a slot in the future, please contact us.

**Corrections – Emil B.** – We will have a booth set up for both alcathons from 12-6 and I am looking for help. I will be having people buy Big Books for prisons and connecting them to whoever wants to volunteer with Ted, Jack, or Maureen. There are not any jail meetings right now – they have been put on hold due to an increase in COVID cases. May start again in January. We still need volunteers to be cleared and ready to volunteer when needed.

**Bridge the Gap – Ryan** – no report.

**PI /CPC – Terry B. / Pat S.** - Committee Member John P. spoke at Grand Rounds at Banner UMC in November to Physicians and U of A Medical Students. Still waiting for a response from Dr. Barbara Eckstein who directs the Pathways in Health and Medicine curriculum, which addresses many of the Social and Behavioral Science topics in the College of Medicine curriculum at the U of A. We Hope to have a response to the “Take a Professional” opportunity we offered to U of A medical students in the 2023 semester. I have had continued contact with Christine P., Clinical Instructor at the U of A accelerated Nursing program, College of Nursing. She is very interested in our “Take a Professional to an AA Meeting” Initiative. And will be discussing this initiative with her nursing faculty colleagues. My Hope is for this initiative to be considered for next semester’s requirements, which cover Behavioral Health and Treatment. Upcoming - The Area CPC Coordinator is having an Area 03 CPC Committee Virtual Conference. The date is January 25th from 12: - 1:30 pm It will be virtual, including guests from GSO. Terry has researched opportunities for Placing PI posters on Sun Tran Buses. Sun Tran reports they have met their “goal” For public announcements notices posted for 2022. PI Initiative - Library Initiative: Assembled packets of AA pamphlets to the Pima County Library were delivered by Terry B. for distribution to local library branches. Next Door App: Karrie T. reports admission requests have slowed over the last 3 months. Overall, 468 admission requests have been vetted for the App since its inception in Spring of 2020. Thank You Karrie! Joint PI/CPC initiative: Final proofs for the new TAI AA contact card and rack card reviewed for final approval at the November meeting. Dottie P. did a fantastic job and we will go to print by the end of December! Thank you Dottie!! April is Alcohol Awareness Month. New Year Alcathon: Mary from the TIA group contacted us and will have a table space for PI/CPC information. We still need Volunteers to man the table during the Alcathon! \*\*PI/CPC committee meets on the 4th Wednesday of the month at Tucson Central office, 5:30 pm\*\* I just want to express my deep appreciation to Tucson Area Intergroup and all our PI/CPC committee members for allowing me to serve as the CPC coordinator over the last 2 years. **Spanish Speaking Liaison – Sara B.** - The AA Hispanic Groups just finished up Unity Week, where groups host and visit each other. A committee was formed for hosting the 2023 Arizona State Convention. On Saturday, 12/10, the Public Information Committee hosted an event "Women in AA" at the Eckstrom-Columbus Library from 1-2:30pm. The Hispanic Intergroup would like to have a literature table at the New Year's Alcathon. They have also found a speaker for the 9am Spanish-speaking meeting on New Year's Day. There will be a potluck at the Hispanic Intergroup Office on Saturday, December 17th 7-8:30pm, 2914 E 22nd St Suite 1.

**Area Liaison/Vice Chair – Chip J.** - Area Assembly - The next AZ Area 03 assembly will be the Pre-Conference Assembly, in March, 2023. It will be in Tucson (hosted by subdistrict 11-114), and I plan to attend in person. District 11 met on Nov. 17, 2022. Treasury \$ 13822.30 less \$1500 prudent reserve = 12322.30 cash available. District Archivist position is open. DCM reports: 11-110/115 (Marty Rex) Looking at doing a GSR workshop. Looking for someone to present. 11-114 (James West).
