## OUR THREE LEGACIES APRIL

4

### STEP Four

*Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.*

### TRADITION Four

*Each group should be autonomous except in matters affecting other groups or A.A. as a whole.*

### CONCEPT Four

*Throughout our Conference structure, we ought to maintain at all responsible levels a traditional "Right of Participation," taking care that each classification or group of our world servants shall be allowing a voting representation in reasonable proportion to the responsibility that each must discharge.*

## Step 4

*You are Looking at the Problem!*

**I think the 4<sup>th</sup> step** is a "turning point" step. We sit down with a pad of paper, having asked God as we understand God to "relieve me of the bondage of self." We are told *why* we take inventory (to clear us of resentments), and *how* to do it (using 4 columns). It's straightforward stuff—supposedly. It's that getting started piece.

For me, what started me on my 4<sup>th</sup> step was a speaker meeting. Phil W. was a friend from my Tuesday night meeting, and he radiated the Program. Whenever Phil would suggest something, I would take it—usually with caution, at first—and I would find out that Phil's ideas were solid. I really liked Phil, but I couldn't place my finger on why.

When Phil told his story from the podium, I knew why: Phil was a domestic violence survivor, and he had used the 12 steps to move forward from the terrible residual hurt that just seems to follow you everywhere when you're a violence survivor. "If Phil W. can use this program to stop my kinds of problems, maybe it'll work in my life."

So, I took a legal pad from Dad's desk at home, sat in my dorm room in college (I got sober at 21), and cried as page after page I detailed the hurt, the anger, and the grief. And, just when I thought I was finished, another name, institution, or something would start the process all over again.

My biggest resentment was me. I *hated* myself—I held expectations of myself that simply weren't reasonable. I had come to believe that, if I did something enough times, things would change—I had convinced myself of things that simply couldn't be. For example, I had convinced myself that, if I just worked hard enough in school, I would be able to conquer the whole list of learning disabilities that I had (and have) and I'd be someone important, like the valedictorian.

Then came the 4<sup>th</sup> column. And, honestly, I couldn't do it—I couldn't fill in what my role was in any of my resentments, fears, or sex inventory. It wasn't that I was being stupid—it was that I genuinely didn't know my role or how to explain it.

To some, this would signal a poorly done 3<sup>rd</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> step; if I was using the steps correctly, some might say, I would have a solid idea of what my role was. I disagree. Like Phil W. taking responsibility for his role in relationships, there were a lot of memories and experiences to unpack. Some of these relationships, experiences, and people were just so much that I needed someone to tell me my role. On the other hand, there were some relationships, events, etc., where, because I did a thorough 3<sup>rd</sup> step, I could see my role.

To anyone who's new, the 4<sup>th</sup> step is freeing. Start where you are.
