*Continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it.*

*Alcoholics Anonymous has no opinion on outside issues; hence the A.A. name ought never be drawn into public controversy.*

*Every service responsibility should be matched by an equal service authority—the scope of such authority to be always well defined whether by tradition, by resolution, by specific job description or by appropriate charters and bylaws.*



## Step 10

### *What Do You Do?*

**I don't recall how long I'd been in sobriety, but it was in my first 2 years or so. I was at my Tuesday night meeting, which held a steady 15 or so folks every week. And I had one burning question: What do you do to like yourself—when everything you know about yourself is bad?**

What I knew about myself, I explained, had come because of the steps—like it's supposed to. I learned about myself from a macro perspective in the 4<sup>th</sup> step; then I learned how my character defects were affecting my life in the 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> steps; then I saw how my behavior affected others in 8 and 9. The housecleaning steps had, indeed, helped set me up for success—but, right then, all I felt was failure.

Step 10, then, became the opportunity to grow into self-respect and self-esteem. It worked like this:

Steps 4-9 gave me concrete examples of my behavior—and it wasn't all bad. It was easier to focus on the "bad." So, given the Big Book emphasizes that we are a mix of things as human beings, it would stand to reason that every day we do *something* right. My challenge, then, was to figure out what that something was.

I started by making lists. By this time, my sponsor had mandated a prayer list for those I resented and a gratitude list to break out of the self-pity that fed my ego. On this list, I put down things that seemed so small to me, that were quite a big deal.

*I'm sober*—Jack Applewhite, an old-timer who helped get me sober, looked me in the eyes and said, "The first two years of sobriety are not for sissies." As I went along the steps—and time occurred—I saw that people who desperately needed to be sober weren't and couldn't be. I felt an "if I can do it, anyone can" type of sentiment—and I was finding out it was simply untrue.

*I pay my bills*—I didn't see the "win" in this for a while in sobriety. When I got sober, I had nothing to pay bills on—I was living at home, on the verge of homelessness. The things I wasn't able to grasp as to why this was a "win" were several: I was employable and able to work at a job to pay for said bills, but not much else. I needed to see, and only did in retrospect, how big an accomplishment it was.

And on and on I went. Down the list I went. What I didn't realize then, that I definitely do now, is these two pieces of truth—these 2 sets of facts—detailed that I was building a new archway. It was, simply put, building a new road. It was going to take time. But I was on my way.

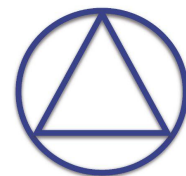
