12

### STEP Twelve

*Having had a spiritual awakening as a result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to alcoholics, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.*

### TRADITION Twelve

*Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions, ever reminding us to place principles before personalities.*

### CONCEPT Twelve

*General Warranties of the Conference: in all its proceedings, the General Service Conference shall observe the spirit of the A.A. Tradition, taking great care that the Conference never becomes the seat of perilous wealth or power; that sufficient operating funds, plus an ample reserve, be its prudent financial principle; that none of the Conference Members shall ever be placed in a position of unqualified authority over any of the others; that all important decisions be reached by discussion vote and whenever possible, by substantial unanimity; that no Conference action ever be personally punitive or an incitement to public controversy; that though the Conference may act for the service of Alcoholics Anonymous, it shall never perform any acts of government; and that, like the Society of Alcoholics Anonymous which it serves, the Conference itself will always remain democratic in thought and action.*

## Step 12

### *Chop Wood, Carry Water*

**Growing up, my Mom** moved more and more toward a Buddhist perspective of living and away from the Catholicism of her childhood. One day, she bought a framed piece of artwork, a calligraphy piece, where the only English words were “Before enlightenment, chop wood, carry water; after enlightenment, chop wood, carry water.”

To me, the 12<sup>th</sup> step isn’t a “finishing” step as much as it is a “growing” step. We now have a solid amount of information about ourselves; we’ve come to see who we are, for the good and the bad. We’ve come to see how we impact others, how we behave in our own lives. We’ve learned a lot.

Now, we have the opportunity to share with others our discoveries. We bring our discoveries into our meetings, sharing what we learned and what we continue to learn about life, ourselves, and more. We maybe go to jails, prisons, rehab centers—any place where someone might be receptive to a new way of thinking. We open up and close the meetings at churches, clubs, parks, community centers, etc.

In other words, we chop wood and carry water.

And when we get into this life, when we make it our daily job to “chop wood and carry water,” there’s always a risk of boredom. Impatience. *Complacency*.

But it is these small, mundane tasks that prevent the boredom. Someone needs to make sure the coffee is made. That the church is cleaned up after the meeting. That the books that got passed out get collected and put away.

Chop wood. Carry water. Share the message.

## Central Office Report for December 2023

**Update on IRS:** IRS requested 60 days to review our accounts and the recently filed 2021 tax forms. We will continue to update the fellowship as we are given information.

**Contributions:** Central Office sends out Big Thanks to the Groups and Individuals who have recently contribute! We are going over budget items line by line and looking at actual expenses. We have and will continue to provide information to Groups who ask. We always hope to give the most accurate information on where contributions go. Keep in mind: since May of 2022, we have a new location, a smaller meeting space, and like everyone else, higher expenses. Staff turnover took a toll on our budget as well. Stay informed about the possibility of an **Ad Hoc Finance Committee** and consider being available to serve in that capacity.

If you or your Group need help, you can always bring the group's information in to Central Office and we'll walk you through how to update it.

**Website Calendar:** It's updated and user-friendly!

**What Central Office does: Schedules, Newsletter (you're reading it!) literature, organizes volunteers and 12 step lists, we do purchasing and sales.**

Every time a change comes in for a meeting or a Group, Central Office staff and our Web Chair, take care of those changes. Perhaps you're not aware that once the website is updated, the **Meeting Guide App** updates automatically from those changes. We also host the Standing Committees of Alcoholics Anonymous, which means we provide their budget, and purchase all the committees literature, schedules and supplies. Treatment. Corrections. Public Information, CPC and PI. Bridging the Gap, Homebound Outreach, Intergroup Liaison & Historian. We coordinate the Home Answering Service and pay the bills for that service. We coordinate Front Desk Volunteers—They answer the phone for the alcoholic who is still suffering, Monday-Friday. They also handle most of the sales. Staff does the purchasing and selling of AAWS and Grapevine Literature. Because we order in bulk several times a month; it may sometimes take a week or so to get precisely what your Group wants, but doing it this way keeps your group from paying shipping costs.

**Price Updates:** Check the Literature Tab on the **website** for current price lists. We realize you'd sometimes like a printed list, but our printed lists are very LONG. Website works best.

**Meeting Schedule:** Due to increased printing costs, schedules are now \$1.50

We are trying to make it printable from the website, keeping costs down.

**Wooden Chips:** Central Office now carries wooden chips with our Intergroup logo on the front and the 24-hour hotline number on the back. They are \$.75 each.

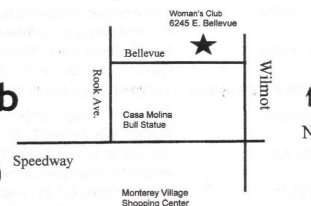
