Seeking Balance

I have been told that Step Four is a fact finding inventory process. For me, this meant taking an impartial assessment of my character traits. In this self examination, I was analyzing and documenting the level of balance for each of my character traits. In other words, I looked for traits that were excessive, traits that were lacking, and traits that were properly balanced. For example, my trait of anger in excessive amounts manifests as rage and resentment. Well balanced anger serves as my internal warning system that something is not okay within myself (I am either hurting or fearful). When my anger trait is lacking, that manifests as me playing the victim and allowing myself to be treated poorly. I have discovered that all of my character traits go from being an asset into being a liability when they become unbalanced. My inventory has been a very valuable tool to show me exactly how to bring each trait back into a more reasonable proportion instead of the extremes I tend to take them into. I have that "all or nothing" mentality and this type of thinking frequently knocks my traits off balance into the "character defect zone". Now that I saw my balance levels more clearly in my inventory, it was time to do something about it! The biggest action I have taken to get my traits balanced has been to stay self aware. I have found that, through this practice of being aware of my traits, I can actually notice when I am off balance somehow because I am no longer calm inside. I start to feel discontent, restless, and irritable (DRI). This tells me it is time to pause and figure out where I am going to extremes. Then I pray for a new thought outlook.
