The slogan "Let go and let God" sums up what step six is all about! As a result of successfully living the spirit of this step, my faith has deepened exponentially because I have a ton of evidence in my life proving to me that my Higher Power takes care of me. 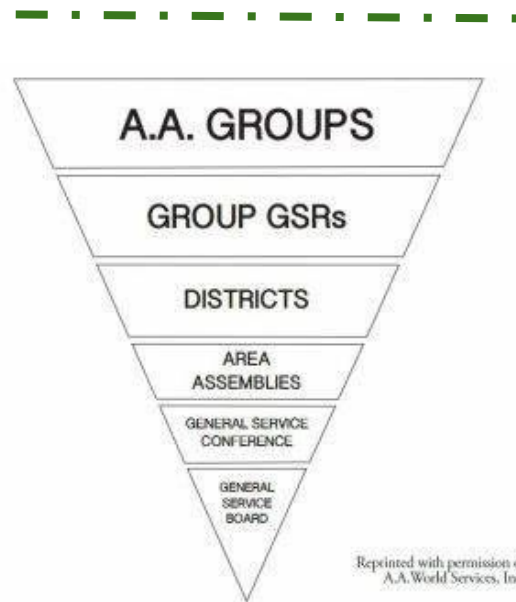
