STEP 10

Growth Opportunities

Step Ten, for me, is where the daily application of the spiritual principles in real life situations takes place. The words in the Big Book are no longer just theoretical words on pages, practicing this step brings them to life through my experiences. I have heard the old timers in our program say, "I work the steps until they work me." How true this statement has become for me! By diligently practicing the principle perseverance of self-restraint every day, I have grown exponentially in wisdom and compassion. This concept is simple, yet very challenging to apply when I encounter situations or people that tend to bring out the worst of my character defects (like my anger). When I become uncomfortably aware that certain scenarios repeatedly manifest my nasty default reactions, then I know that an opportunity to grow has been placed in front of me by my Higher Power. For example, recently it was put in front of me to practice being vulnerable enough to admit out loud when I am feeling insecure, frightened, or emotionally hurt by a situation rather than behave in my standard automatic aggressively combative manner. Talk about some "heavy lifting!" This is where I must ask my Higher Power for enough clarity to become aware when I am doing this, enough compassion for myself to accept that it is okay to need a lot of practice, and then enough courage to take action to change by doing something different. I have found doing things differently can be frightening due to unfamiliarity. I know what to expect with my default reactions and they are easily automatic. It takes a lot of commitment to be consistent about not allowing myself to merely react and to consciously act in a more reasonable way. Personality transformation is my reward!

What did Bill W think about keeping AA's history and what was his vision?

Patrick F., Chair of the Historical Committee, has put out a call for group histories from Tucson and the surrounding areas. Right now he has 80 group histories of the approximately 300 groups in District 11 that encompasses Tucson and the surrounding areas of Pima County. Send in your group's history (form/format on Page 6). Below is Bill's vision for remembering our collective start as a movement from M-44i, Archives Workbook:

The idea for organizing an historical collection of the Fellowship's records came from co-founder Bill W. in the early 1950s. Bill was becoming increasingly concerned that "the history of Alcoholics Anonymous is still veiled in the deep fog." Knowing that the office correspondence was loosely maintained in the drawers at the General Headquarters, he set out to arrange our historical records. He personally recorded oldtimers' recollections in the Akron/Cleveland area; he sent out boxes of blank tapes to others, encouraging them to record their recollections.

Bill's far-reaching vision outlined an archival message that is still sound today. As he said: "Every one of the new and unexpected developments (in A.A.) has, lying just underneath, an enormous amount of dramatic incident and experience—stories galore....It isn't hard to prepare a fact sheet of what happened— that is, dates when people came in, groups started and so forth. The hard thing to lay hold of is the atmosphere of the whole proceedings and anecdotal material that will make the early experience alive." After many decades of tireless organizing and arranging, the G.S.O. Archives room was opened with a formal ribbon-cutting ceremony in November 1975.

Since then, the G.S.O. archivists and the trustees serving on the Archives Committee of the General Service Board have encouraged the importance of archival service, which is vital to the survival of the Fellowship. As a result of that work, today almost all areas have set collections, and there is a significant growth at the district level.
