On the other hand, when I stubbornly refuse to trust in my Higher Power because I think I know best, that is akin to swimming headlong into the rapids in an attempt to make it upstream, exerting myself to the point of exhaustion. I get absolutely nowhere doing that! I have learned that when I have done all the footwork I am able to do for any given objective, that is when I must take a step back and let my Higher Power take over. Chances are, if I am having to force an outcome or if I am encountering a multitude of unreasonable setbacks, I am in my own will! When opportunities seem to just appear before me in a smooth sequence of solutions, I know my will is in full alignment!

Jennifer: we are flush but we have had losses, so we are really not flush. Ted said that's because contributions go down in the summer.

Eileen mentioned that we have a lot of savings/in reserve.

Addendum to the notes: Jennifer Y: During the call for discussion under new business For the changes to proposed funding of the 3 Intergroup events Founders' day and the Christmas and New Year's Alcothons I stated that I believed we had a net loss for the year in 2024 and the chair stated that I was incorrect. I believe that a quick check of last January's Intergroup meeting will in fact support my statement, besides our year-end financial reports. In fact there were net losses for the last 5 months of 2024 totaling nearly \$18,000.

Chair response: Jennifer is correct. The Aug-Dec 2024 treasurer's reports show a loss of -\$18,973.07. QuickBooks for the 2024 calendar year shows a 12-month loss of - \$3,988.55, and a net loss for 2023 of \$18,287.

Jennifer wants the IG and JFT link for notes. Susan gave the email and will send a newcomer's packet.

John W. asked about financing of Christmas and New Years Alcothons and how they are being funded.

Dee asked about Thanksgiving and it was said that it's independent to Central Office.

Whitey mentioned that Thanksgiving Alcothon is up in the air for location because Smoke Free Nooners can't do it.
