STEP 8

Taking responsibility with lots of help...

Step 8 seems like such a straightforward and kind of easy Step. It asks us to do two things: make a list and become willing to make amends. But, like most of the 12 Steps and living recovery, a lot of stuff is simple—but it's not easy.

In my first 8th Step list, I put down my mom. She was one of the main people I wrote about in my 4th Step. I thought I was willing to make amends, but my sponsor told me I wasn't ready. That was a surprise. I thought I was following all the guidelines, but my sponsor saw that my raw anger meant I needed to wait on the amends. Since I was still clueless in AA-Land and followed all my sponsor's directions, I made other amends but left my mom off that initial list for Step 8. And my sponsor was right.

I was able to work through enough of my anger to get back to my part in my resentment from Step 4 and to clarify what I needed to make amends for, to understand what I was responsible for. I couldn't have done that without the intensive help of my sponsor. One thing I had to watch out for was Step-projecting. I knew if I wrote about a resentment in Step 4, that the person I resented would be on my list in Step 8, and I'd have to make amends in Step 9. If I wanted to avoid all that amends-making, I could just ignore the resentment in the first place! But if I pay attention to each step and complete it to the best of my ability with all the help I need, I know I'm working a program that helps me lead an authentic life, one that fits my soul and heart.

 - b. Corrections – Marty T.: Our quarterly Corrections Committee meeting is this Saturday, July 18th from 11-12:30, in person at Central Office or on Zoom. All are welcome! We are experiencing lots of changes at the State prison, as the security has been ramped up. Cimarron Unit has not allowed any volunteers in since the beginning of June and there are stricter clearance procedures at the main control. 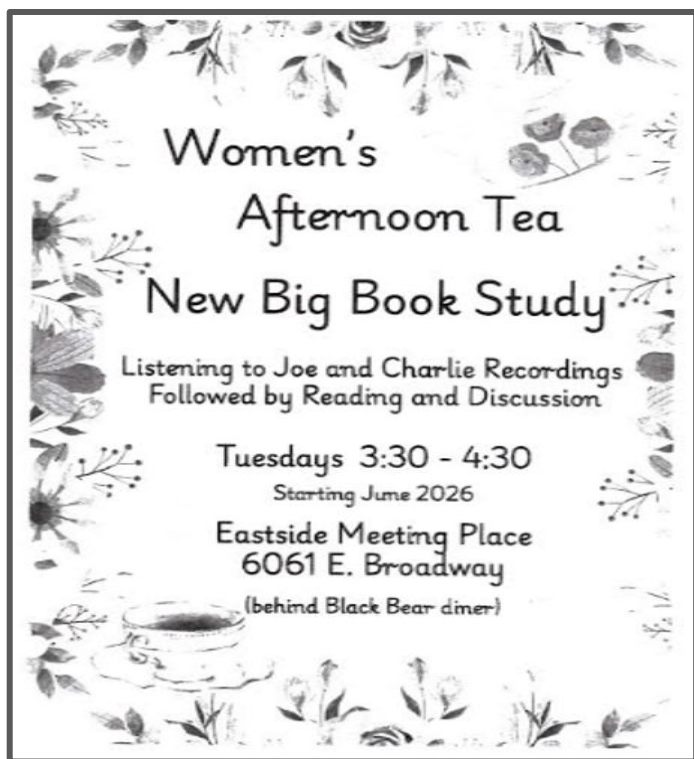

Group History: Telephone Big Book Study, a forerunner of Homebound Outreach

Per Bob P: On February 17, 1992, Vicki H., Bob P., and Chuck I. were in their respective homes, miles apart. Vicki was recovering from an illness and Chuck had workmen repairing his house after a recent robbery. He wanted to delay the meeting, but really needed it, having resentment over his house being robbed. Using 3-way calling, they decided to use a Big Book format to keep the focus squarely on recovery. Bob said it was truly like a regular meeting except they didn't pass the basket and they really didn't use it with anyone really new in recovery. The early members said it was a godsend, with Vicki saying it relieved her isolation. Other early members included Walt W. and Gus D. It wasn't really a regular meeting, one just employed as needed. The story of this first meeting was published in the August 1995 issue of the AA Grapevine.
